PRESIDENT'S REPORT

ROSSICA AND BALTIC AREA SHOW AT BALPEX 2011



The big "Rossica and Baltic Area" show – our Annual General Meeting – will be held this year at BALPEX on 2-4 September, with 131 frames of material in our area on display. (See below for a list of the exhibits.) This event – for us, at least – will be second only to ROSSICAPEX 2009 in size. Those interested in attending


The jury consists of Dr. Peter P. McCann (Chairman), Akthem Al-Manaseer, John M. Hotchner, Dr. Yamil H. Kouri and Yacov Tsachor.

Our featured speaker will be our Editor, Dr. William Moskoff, who will give a talk on "The People's War: Defiance and Resistance During World War II in the Soviet Union." Bill is no stranger to this kind of presentation, having given one of the three Rossica papers at the National Postal Museum's Blount Symposium last year.

The Annual General Meeting will give members a chance to toss kudos or hurl invective at the officers in person, and there will be news and an announcement or two that should be of considerable interest to everyone.

This year's show will see the culmination of the Rossica five-year vignette series honoring our Society's founders, movers and shakers – a souvenir sheet designed by Bill Dwyer that incorporates all four of the preceding vignettes drawn by Catherine Nickle. The first

vignette honoring Eugene Arkhangelsky (CHICAGOPEX 2007) was followed by issues commemorating Gregory Salisbury (BALPEX 2008), S.V. Prigara (ROSSICAPEX 2009) and Alexander Chebotkevich (RMSS 2010). Each one appeared in both an English and a Russian version, and this souvenir sheet will be no different. Unfortunately, the firm in Berlin, Germany that produces these vignettes didn't have the machinery to perform internal perforations, so these two souvenir sheets will be produced imperforate.

We are taking advance orders now for these sheets: \$5 for mint copies (two each per customer), or if you would prefer to have them tied on cover and sent from the show on Friday, September 2nd ("first day covers"), please remit \$7 per sheet to the Treasurer by check or via PayPal through our website (again, two of a kind per customer, i.e., two English- and two Russian version sheets). Past history has shown that the previous two Rossica souvenir sheets (1957 and 1976) are rarely encountered on cover. The latest souvenir sheets will be tied on cover and accompanied by USPS stamps (subject unsold) with a Rossica theme.

There will be definitely be one and perhaps two dealers in attendance with strong stocks in our area, and a number of others with decent representations. And, of course, Rossica will have a booth there, with all manner of literature, Society paraphernalia and gewgaws for sale or distribution.

As for the exhibits, there will be many strong displays, a fair number of them not seen in this area before, and no one will be able to complain about a lack of variety. When was the last time you saw a Georgian exhibit? Estonian, Tannu Tuvan and Mongolian displays aren't exactly common, either. Then there are brand new exhibits, never before shown, like Russian POW "Thank You" cards and Leningrad Blockade mail. Others that have been shown before have been revamped and expanded. In all, 24 exhibits, ranging from traditional to Cinderella, from postal history to thematic.

The Evolution of "Via Siberia" Mail: 1899 -1945[1]

A chronological showing of the postal evolution of mail sent over the Trans-Siberian Rail Network between 1899 and 1945. *10 frames*

The Poezd and Pochta Postmarks of the "Little Railroads" of St. Petersburg

A collection of the rare Poezd and Pochta postmarks of the small railroads of St. Petersburg. *1 frame*

Stalin on Stamps, Covers, and Postcards: Philately at the Service of Dictatorship

A comprehensive collection of philatelic materials - stamps, covers, FDCs, cachets - with Stalin's image on them. Collateral material includes postal cards, caricatures, leaflets, etc. The exhibit is organized in chronological order. *10 frames*

The "3-Star" Issues of Latvia: 1921-1933

A study of the proofs, issues, errors (perf, printing,

watermark) and postal uses of the 1921-1933 "3-Star" issues of Latvia (YOUTH Age 21). 5 frames

Russian Rural Post (Zemstvo) Use of Partial Stamps

Displays examples from Zemstvos known (thus far) to have used partial stamps to frank mail. The use of partial stamps was dictated by the available supply of a given denomination and was always short lived. Includes only known use of bisected stamps by Kotelnich and Sumy Zemstvos. *1 frame*

"Muscovy's Mayflies": Imperial Russia's Temporary Post Offices from 1898 to 1917 [5]

Examines and surveys the various kinds of civilian and military temporary post offices in Russia up to 1917 and the events or localities they served. *8 frames*

Russia Pre-UPU Stampless Mail to the West [1]

Examines the routes, rates and markings of stampless mail, unpaid, pre-paid and part paid until Russia joined the Universal Postal Union (UPU) in 1874. 8 frames

Classic Mongolia 1886-1932 SEP

Exhibit of covers from three varying postal administrations: Imperial Russian Offices (1886 -1909), Chinese Postal Administrations (1909-1931) and Mongolian Postal Administration (1922-1932). 5 frames

Soviet Union Postage Stamp Advertising Labels 1923-1927 [EP]

Exhibit portrays a brief but unique period in Soviet philately hen postage was used to advertise state run enterprises. *I frame*

Unrecognized and Overlooked Zemstvo Mailsep

In addition to issuing stamps for Russian Rural post mail service (zemstvo), there were zemstvos that provided mail service but did not issue stamps. Collectors ignored or failed to recognize processed postal sendings as zemstvo mail since no stamps were used. 8 frames

The Mail of the Leningrad Blockade: September 1941 - January 1944 [17]

Includes postally used picture postcards printed before and during the siege of Leningrad (1941-1944); together

with blockade-related letters and documents they illustrate various aspects of one of the most important battles of WW II. 6 frames

The Small Heads of the First Definitive Set of the USSR^[T]

Mint and used stamps and covers are interwoven into a fabric which illustrates the evolution of the small heads of the first definitive stamp issue of the USSR. 10 frames

Imperial Postmarks of the Trans-Siberian Railroad: Chelyabinsk to Manchzhuriya

Representation of the postmarks of the various lines on the Trans-Siberian Railroad, as well as the large stations (Vokzals) and small stations(stantsiyas) that could cancel mail along the route between Chelyabinsk and Manchzhuriya. 8 frames

Tannu Tuva 1921-1943 SEP

Showing of Tuva stamps, covers, stationery. 5 frames

Russian Soviet Federated Socialist Republic SEP

Stamps and their usage of the RSFR including special studies of the stamp production. 7 frames

Keeping the Faith: Vignettes of the Old Russian Diaspora

Tells the story of Russian émigré social life abroad during the decades of repressive Communist rule in their homeland. Highlights include early scouting, political, and charity vignettes, as well as local post stamps of post-World War II DP camps, "Free Russia" propaganda issues, Orthodox church labels, vignettes of philatelic societies, youth organizations, and others. 8 frames

Republic of Georgia - First Issue

The stamps, printing varieties and usage. 4 frames

"God Bless You for Your Kindness": "Thank You" Postcards of Russian Prisoners of the Great War

This exhibit consists of "Thank You" postal cards sent by Russian prisoners of war of WW I to the family of Dr. Katz who supported dozens of prisoners by sending food parcels .Some supporting material is added. *I frame*

Carpatho-Ukraine 1944-1945

Traces the development of postal services from liberation in October 1944 until the territory was incorporated into the Soviet Union. *10 frames*

Odessa: Clandestine Mail Surveillance, 1920-1940[1]

Traces the development of Soviet clandestine mail surveillance markings in Odessa from 1920 to 1940. Displaying all recorded types. *1 frame*

The Emperor's Mail SEP

Traces the development of the special postal arrangements for the Imperial family, top ministers and foreign diplomats in Imperial Russia. *1 frame*

The Airpost Issues of Lithuania: A Traditional Study [1]

Traditional study of pre-1940 airpost issues with original drawings, essays, proofs, specimens, varieties, errors, and usages. 8 frames

Estonia Postal History 1918-1941 SEP

Illustrates the stamps issues after Independence until it fell under the control of the Soviet Union. All issues as shown on covers or postcards - most with correct postal rates. *4 frames*

Rossica's Vignettes 1938-2010

(Society display.) Shows all of the vignettes issued by the Society, along with a few essays and postal usages. *I frame*

ROSSICA WEBSITE IS UPDATED Did You Notice?

If you have visited our website lately, you might have noticed some subtle changes to the pages, but then again, maybe not. From a webmastering, IT-guy point of view, there have been a lot of changes to what we call in the industry "the back end" and also the code. With no intention of getting into a technical discussion, websites

and the software coding behind the websites are based on international standards. As standards change, so do the web browsers, like Microsoft's Internet Explorer, Mozilla's Firefox, Apple's Opera, and many others. Eventually, old code and old standards will not work on newer browsers, so the imperative we have is to ensure that you see what we want you to see by keeping base with the new standards.

The current initiative is to rewrite the code supporting the website using the latest HTML (hypertext markup language) standard and the latest CSS or Cascading Style Sheet standards. The basic site with all of the 'normal' pages, like the home page, links, membership, etc. has all been converted over to the latest standards so we are as up to date as we can be in that arena.

We also updated the code behind the central section of the homepage where we post news and announcements. The update includes an administrative page where anyone with appropriate privileges can login and post news updates, much like a blog. This eliminates the need for the webmaster to be the middle man when important news and announcements need to be posted. Plus, it just looks better!

The Samovar is not open to new registrations for now because of a series of registrations by persons who have malicious intent against our website and our members. Until we can safely open the registration process to the public, I can set you up easily. Send me an email with your desired user name and the email address you wish to use for your registration and I will set you up.

What else is new and what is on the horizon? Not much else is new, but there are plenty of projects on the "to-do" list for our website. Among these are a member's portal that is not accessible publicly and would allow you as a member to access and update your information, such as address, email, etc., and an online, searchable library index. We need volunteers with web development experience to help out with these efforts, so if you are available, let me know and we can get started.

Finally, as always, I have to ask – what you want to see on the website? When you access <u>rossica.org</u>, what do you want to be able to do? What information is lacking or missing? Please don't hesitate to point these out to me as the webmaster, at our annual meetings, or post something on the Samovar.
